



Lauria raftForms 2024 Juror Curator, Writer, Educator

As the juror for *CraftForms 2024*, I was privileged to review hundreds of submissions from leading craft

artists across the United States and internationally. The annual exhibition at the Wayne Art Center has evolved into a barometer of creativity's vibrant diversity, tracing today's visual culture through distinctive works rooted in traditional craftsmanship and material exploration. As an experienced curator, I utilized my "responsive eye" to identify works that most clearly demonstrated craft's complexity and ingenuity.

The exhibition brings together diverse approaches by artists from different generations and cultural perspectives, challenging our understanding of craft's complex framework. While automation, artificial intelligence, and digital technologies are transforming work and social structures, the human-driven need to stimulate imagination and pursue beauty remains central. The selected works speak to artists' continued growth, skill, and ability to reflect on the human condition.

Personal, geographic, and cultural meanings are woven into provocative compositions of fiber, thread, beads, clay, wood, glass, and metal. Functional objects become exuberant hybrids of utility and sculpture: chairs and benches blur lines between practical design and artistic expression. Jewelry and art wear transform the human body into an armature, while household objects like brooms, vessels, and baskets convey deeper cultural issues of longing, purification, protection, identity, and empowerment.

The common thread throughout the artwork is a profound love and respect for labor in the making, celebrating the joy and catharsis of the craft process. Each piece narrates a story of how craft defines and connects us across time and cultures. awakening our curiosity about the limitlessness of human imagination.

I extend a sincere appreciation to all the artists who, through their creative output, provide viewers the opportunity to collect objects that contain memories and reflections of our shared humanity. Once collected, these objects may, in turn, become inherited treasures, becoming part of the continuum of craft. Their work reminds us that despite technological advances, the human impulse to create, transform, and express remains powerfully alive.

Jo Lauria is a Los Angeles based curator, author and educator. Her forward-thinking advocacy for the handmade has been rewarded with a lifetime of acclaimed projects. A specialist in craft, design, and decorative arts, Lauria is currently Adjunct Curator of the American Museum of Ceramic Art (Pomona, CA) and Faculty at Otis College of Art and Design. She is also known from her tenure as Curator of Decorative Arts at Los Angeles County Museum of Art.


From a diverse and impressive pool of submissions, Jo selected 103 works by 101 artists, representing 34 states and 3 countries--Canada, Japan and Taiwan. Works include basketry, ceramics, fiber, furniture, glass, jewelry, metal, mixed media, paper, wearable art, wood and 3D printing. Of special note, we are excited to have many new entrants participate this year and more than 30 exhibiting artists affiliated with art educational institutions throughout the United States and abroad.

We are also delighted to once again partner with *browngrotta arts* to present Japandi Revisited: shared aesthetics and influences, the companion exhibition to CraftForms 2024. Curated by Tom Grotta and Rhonda Brown of browngrotta arts, this eclectic exhibition explores common approaches shared between Japanese and Scandinavian cultures through art. Japandi Revisited features 39 contemporary fiber and ceramic artists from Japan, Denmark, Norway, Sweden, and Finland whose works reflect similar sensibilities including an appreciation for integrating nature and natural materials and a near reverence for exquisite craftsmanship.


